Guest Speakers

Julieanne Kost: A Principal Digital Imaging Adobe Evangelist, 'Through the Eyes of Julieanne Kost'

Julieanne's portfolio of aerial photography was inspirational. The patterns, colours and design were incredible. Her creative image compositing, was awe inspiring. She willingly shared and demonstrated her craft in both Lightroom and Photoshop with the attendees. She spoke about image compositing techniques and the application of diptych arrangements for image presentation. Julieanne's second lecture was a two hour practical explanation of Lightroom, then using layers and masks in Photoshop. Allen Kleiman: Photography mentor and coach, 'Big Pictures from Small Cameras and Smart Phones'

Small cameras can take big pictures! His instructive explanations on the variety of small cameras, their strengths, weaknesses, anonymity, portability and his "Eight Small Camera Essentials" gave the audience an insight into these cameras. His second lecture ran through the Nik Software collection, giving people an insight into their use.

Shireen Hammond: Master of Photography III, 'Rekindling the Fire - Overcoming Hardship and the Importance of Personal Projects'

Skills, passion and a very emotional story about her survival through a life threatening illness was beautifully presented with grace, humour and exceptional photography. This was teamed with two spectacular audio visuals of Shireen's work. The main message that came from her presentation was to spend more time with family, take more family photos and finish your personal photography projects, whatever they may be. Her workshop the following day, at the historic Shamrock Hotel, explored boudoir photography, posing, lighting and business advice. It was a great insight into the complexities of this specialised business and the skills one would need to create such beautiful intimate photography.

The auditorium was full for Derek's talk, no doubt partly due to his company's generous gift of a P600 Epson printer. Derek detailed the workflow necessary to produce beautiful prints from home.

He began with the essential step of calibrating your monitor on a regular basis, following on with soft proofing and profile printing. One lucky photographer received a Spyder4 calibrator. The winner of the Epsom printer was Dennis Nolan, from the Frankston Photographic Club. The company is also offering deals for members of camera clubs.
