### **APRIL WORKSHOP April 20th and 23rd**

#### Portrait photography with Rebecca Nicolandos.

Rebecca is an experienced portrait photographer specialising in the area of Weddings, Babies and Family photography. Wednesday night saw 17 members attend a theory



session at the clubrooms where Rebecca showed us in great detail the steps she takes in the making of a good portrait. We were each told to take a photo of another member at the start of the session and then listened to Rebecca explain how to pose your subject and move them into positions to make your image as flattering as possible. We also had demonstrations with members acting as models to reinforce what we had been shown.

We were also shown the camera and lenses she uses and camera settings to achieve the results you are striving for. At the end of the session we took another photo of the same member and hopefully we all achieved a much better result.

Saturday afternoon saw us meeting at Elizabeth St for the

practical stage of the workshop which again saw 17 members attending. We also had seven models who



generously gave up their time so we could implement the skills we learnt on Wednesday night. Rebecca gave us an introductory talk and then we split up into three groups and the groups rotated around the models with a mentor in each group helping with posing and making the models feel comfortable.



We moved from there to the corner of Winter and Sutton St where there are some tall trees where we practiced taking action shots of our models walking, running, jumping and climbing. The afternoon was rounded off

with some of us meeting at the Yacht Club for a cuppa and a chat.

#### August. Wednesday the 24th at the clubrooms at 7.30pm.



# CONGRATULATIONS

Jill Wharton has done very well in a 2016 International Salon Photo Competition and we congratulate her on this success. She writes -

" I received notification in February that in the Bristol International Salon, 2016, Photo Travel Section, I received 15 out of 15 for 'Masai Warrior' plus an Honorable Mention.

In the Nature Section I received 13 out of 15 for 'After the Rain', which is an Acceptance.

Both photos were taken in Africa; the warrior in the Tarangire National Park and the young lions

in the Ngorongoro Crater, in the February of 2015. The boy has undergone a right of passage or coming of age ritual involving circumcision, after which he must remain in black clothes for 4-8 months. Then he is considered to be a warrior and is seen as protector of the village. It used to be the case that before each boy could undergo the ceremony he had to kill a lion but that is no longer allowed as East Africa has banned lion hunting.

The young lions were caught in a sudden heavy shower of rain and there is virtually no shelter in the crater so they looked very miserable and huddled down together. As it eased they started to sit up and look



around for some action!"
