## Get ready for the biggest FiPP of all!

Now that 2017 has finally arrived, the organising committee of the **Fremantle International Portrait Prize** (FiPP) welcomes *all* photographers, amateur and pros alike, to vie for one of Australia's fastest-growing photography awards.

It's a whole 'new-look' FiPP too. As you can see from the information below, the New Year has rung in some important changes. Check our <u>website</u> and <u>Facebook</u> regularly in the lead up to the **June 12** kick-off of this year's competition.

For those new to FiPP, we're a not-for-profit group (based in Fremantle in Western Australia). We run an ethical, worldwide competition every two years to find the World's best digital portrait photograph. This is the fourth event and each time participation has grown in leaps and bounds. Oh... and we also donate whatever entry fees we receive that we don't need to keep FiPP going to charity. Currently our beneficiary is Arthritis and Osteoporosis WA, a very worth cause indeed, given that 60% of all of us will suffer from some form of AO in our lifetimes. We're adding a mobile phone only section for FiPP2017. Details are still being finetuned (so keep an eye on our Facebook) but the plan is to allow entry into the main (\$5,000 first-prize) competition for portraits created with any kind of digital photographic device while offering a separate entry path for those who prefer only to compete with other mobile phone photographers. At this stage the prize for the phone section will be\$1,000 cash but the entry fee will only be half of that for the main award. More details to come...

Our website will also carry important news and, of course, provide all the rules and regulations you'll need to successfully enter the award.

Entry fees for FiPP2017 have been set at \$20 per image for the 'open' FiPP and \$10 for the mobile-phone-only section.

#### Print Salon 2017

The VIGEX 19th International Print Salon will be conducted in 2017. Entries are now open at <a href="www.vigex.org.au">www.vigex.org.au</a> and will close on 8 May. The Salon offers six print-only sections: Monochrome Open, Colour Open, Nature, Creative, PhotoTravel and People.

The first three of these sections are also available as Print sections at the Maitland Salon closing in February 2017 and the Committee has arranged a 'send-on' facility for participants who wish to enter prints at both Maitland and VIGEX. We hope that this will encourage an increase in entries at both Salons. VIGEX entrants who use this arrangement will be able to send entries for all 6 VIGEX sections to Maitland as one package and they will be forwarded to VIGEX in due course.

The Committee applied to the City of Greater Geelong for a Community Arts Grant to help cover the cost of a printed catalogue for the Salon, but unfortunately this was unsuccessful. As a result, the 2017 Salon will have a DVD catalogue only.
