### **ANNUAL DINNER**

On Saturday 29th of July a group of about 50 enthusiasts got together at the Midlands Golf Club for the 2016 - 2017 Annual Competition Dinner. The group was made up of club members, family, friends and special guest and judge Jeremy Bannister.

Jeremy, a professional photographer with a background of forty years of photojournalism, fashion photography and documentary film making has had eighteen years on staff with the Ballarat Courier, and has created images over the years for several well-known car, bike and truck magazines.

Members and guests enjoyed a viewing of mounted prints and a digital display of EDPI images, and everybody mingled, caught up on news, and chatted over a drink and a meal. It was an opportunity for all (including potential new members) to appreciate the variety and standard of the entries from the past year and for some of the newer members to get to know other club members and to put a face to names they would have recognised from the monthly competition entries.

Following the meal there was a digital display of;

- 13 entries in the Novice section
- 20 in Print Colour/Monochrome and 58 in EDPI Colour/Monochrome
- 8 in Print Nature and 24 in EDPI Nature
- 11 in Print Landscape/Seascape and 30 in EDPI Landscape/Seascape
- 6 in Print People/Portrait and 11 in EDPI People/Portrait
- 3 in EDPI Creative but no entries for Print Creative.

There was a grand total of 184 images from 25 entrants, a good increase on 124 entries in 2016 and 104 in 2015.

Positive feedback was given by Jeremy for each of the highly commended and winning entries. The Herb Richmond Trophy for Print of the Year was awarded to Greg Tate for his evocative print "Two Women", the Roger Purcell Perpetual Trophy for EDPI of the Year

went to Steve Demeye for his striking image "Balconies" and the Bon Strange Perpetual Trophy for Novice Image of the year went to Janette Richards for her beautiful capture entitled "In the Garden". The Top Score, with an impressive 119.5 went to Chris Crossley. Jeremy, who has judged numerous Camera Club competitions commented that the overall standard of the entries for the year was very high.

Betty Bibby received the David Grigg Recognition Award for her tireless work for the club.

The finale for the night was an extremely interesting and informative photographic presentation and talk from Jeremy Bannister, describing his recent experiences in Nepal. His photography was both touching and beautiful, and did much in portraying the plight of the Nepalese people following the recent catastrophic earthquake there, but equally he was able to show the friendliness and welcoming nature of these people. It was thought provoking to hear Jeremy extolling the virtues of natural light photography and photojournalism.

## **JUDGE for OCTOBER - Robert McKay**

I have been interested in photography from an age of about 10. My first camera was a Kodak Starlight. During my teens I purchased a Nikonos underwater camera while being interested in SCUBA diving. After giving up going underwater, I decided to concentrate on photography as a main pastime.

I joined the Melbourne Camera Club (MCC) in 1975 and was elected to committee in Late 1970's and served two years as Vice-President. Then I was seconded to the Victorian Association of Photographic Societies (VAPS) in 1985 to assist in the running of the National Photographic Exhibition run jointly by the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria (RASV) in conjunction with VAPS. I took on position of Chairman of this Exhibition (RASV/VAPS) in 1988 and ran the Exhibition until 1996. During this time I established a "Junior Category" for Primary and Secondary schools and introduced Landscape and Experimental Categories into the Exhibition. I was instrumental in obtaining the sponsorship for the Exhibition – through "Michael's Camera and Video".

With VAPS, I organised and ran the Interclub Photographic Competition between all camera clubs in the state of Victoria from 1987 to 1998. I also organised the state entry into a National Camera Club Exhibition between the Australian states and territories. Between 1993 and 1994 I became President of VAPS. I also was invited to join the Committee of The Victorian International Exhibition of Photography (VIGEX) in Geelong. This is the only International Photographic Exhibition in Victoria. It is the only Exhibition where Victorian photographers can compare their work with the work from overseas. The Exhibition is displayed biennially at the Geelong Art Gallery and was then also displayed in the National Gallery in St Kilda Rd.

I moved to Phillip Island in 1993, resigning as a member of the MCC and joined the Warragul Camera Club. Together with another photographer (Joan Williams) we established the Phillip Island Camera Club in 1994.

From there I ran three successful charity photographic auctions – two for the Autistic Society of Victoria at the Rosanna Camera Club and another on Phillip Island for the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation of Victoria in conjunction with the Phillip Island Inner Wheel Club and Phillip Island Rotary Club. The sale of Photographs in these events earned in excess of \$8000.

I have entered most Australian National and International Exhibitions and also into several overseas International Exhibitions and have been successful in having many photographs accepted in them. I travelled to Africa in 2005 visiting Kenya, Tanzania and Rwanda. Photographs from this trip were the basis of my only sole exhibition of prints in 2006 at The Red Lion Gallery on Phillip Island. I have also exhibited photographs with other photographers in several small exhibitions.

I now work solely in Digital Photography, but did have my own darkroom for Black and White, Colour Negative and Cibachrome developing and printing.

For a while I have worked semi professionally as a wedding photographer and have had several photographs published in books and magazines.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Photography was invented in the 1830s as a black and white medium. In 1861, James Clerk Maxwell, a Scottish physicist, collaborated with Thomas Sutton to create the first colour image. Red, green and blue filters were used to photograph a tartan ribbon.

The three negatives were simultaneously projected onto a screen using the same coloured combining to make one image.
